1974 Terminal Middle Woodland Points in Maryland. *Maryland Archaeology* 10(1&2):19-29.

In this brief and highly technical article, the author provides great detail about his own collection of 89 terminal Middle Woodland (ca. A.D. 600 – 1000) projectile points. He states that they were recovered from surface collections in Maryland (n=80), New Jersey (n=7), and Pennsylvania (n=2). Four radiocarbon dates from New York sites with similar point styles are provided for context (p. 20). A preliminary chronology is proposed for the period that begins with the Middle Woodland Fox Creek stemmed spearpoints, followed by terminal Middle Woodland arrowheads (Jack's Reef corner-notched, followed by an unnamed lanceolate, of which Jack's Reef pentagonal is a variety), and ends with the Late Woodland Levanna triangular arrowheads. A line drawing and metric data are provided for each point and point fragment in the collection (pp. 20-29).
